Treasurer's report

The summer has been good. Both revenue and expenses are currently very close to 60% of the budget for the year.

If we were exactly on course, that would be 67%, but the two are keeping pace. Finances always run slowly over the summer.

We budgeted to pay 75% of our cost of ministry, and to the end of August we have paid just over 50% of the year's budgeted amount. Since ministry costs are a large part of our budget, that amounts to some \$10,800 short.

This is usually the time of year when we are furthest from our goals, and I expect receipts to go up as people return to regular church-going.

On a very positive note, we received a \$10,000 grant towards the repairs incurred last year on the rectory, and so were able to make an extra-budget payment of this amount to the diocese.



# Festival of Lesson and Carols December 10 at 7 pm

The service of nine lessons and carols for Christmas (the "Carol Service") began in England in 1878. The choir of Truro Cathedral, in Cornwall, sang a service of carols on Christmas Eve. The service has been in continuous use since 1880, and made most popular by its broadcast from King's College Chapel in Cambridge, England. The service consists of readings from the Old Testament from the Fall of Humanity to prophecies of the birth of a Saviour, and then readings from the New Testament of the birth of Jesus and the meaning of his coming. Between the readings are carols, some sung by the choir, and some for all to join in. There is no sermon, just a glorious telling of the Christmas story with singing.

Put this service on your calendar now, so that it does not get crowded out.

Rehearsals for the musicians are on Thursday evenings at 7:30, and all singers are welcome. If you would like to contribute on an instrument, contact Anne Coates.
